What's New in Dominican Republic:

- Dominican Republic Extends Free health Coverage Plan for Tourists | The Ministry of Tourism of the Dominican Republic extended the travel assistance plan until April 30 of 2021, which offers insurance to tourists who arrive by air to the country and stay in a hotel. The insurance starts the moment they check-in at a hotel, covering all kinds of medical emergencies, including COVID-19.
