- Dominican Republic on Track to Welcome 6.3 Million Tourists This Year | According to the Technical Vice Minister of Tourism, the country is on track to reach its goal of 6.3 million tourist arrivals in 2017. Dominican Republic is also projected to reach 80,000 hotel rooms by the end of the year, a result of increasing tourism growth and hotel openings this year.
